Location: Steyning Downland

Brief Description: Steyning, West Sussex. Meet at 09.00 hrs by the main bus stop, half way up the High Street (What3Words ///country.unwell.flexibly), opposite the clock tower. There are two well signed car parks which can be used (with toilets). The walk

does have one uphill and a corresponding downhill, but relatively short and at an easy pace, and the grid ref for the start of the walk is TQ172115/ What3Words///verges.rush.firebird. This is a three hour walk and suggests a 20 minute coffee break around half way. (Bring your own drink) Spring bird arrivals especially Nightingales will be looked for.
